BIOSKETCH

Robert completed a Bachelor of Science with honours (IIA) at Monash University in 1982 and then a Doctorate in Biochemistry graduating in 1985 from the same Campus.

After completing his Ph. D, Robert worked in the pharmaceutical industry for six years. Throughout this time, he ran *in vitro* research laboratory working on vascular prosthesis, became a Development Chemist and worked in clinical and research Biochemistry.

Around 1989, Robert became an Accredited Clinical Educator / Assessor by Department of Human Services (DHS 92/003) under the Victorian Accredited Driver Education Program (VADEP).

Due to his interest in holistic Health and caring for people, Robert founded the Academy of Health Education of Victoria (AHEV) in the same year.

Robert became an active PD trainer and consultant for many years to various government and non-government departments and organisations such as Health department, VAADA, Pleasant View, General Practitioners Divisions including Conferences for Magistrates, Registrars and Department of Corrections and Justice.

Robert also became in the bio-psycho-social model for addiction encompassing biological / genetic basis (Nature) along with psycho-social (Nurture) factors. This was considered as unique advantage to understanding the combined model approach as most therapists in Australia heavily rely on the Psycho-social model of counselling, namely, "harm minimisation". Consequently, Robert provided tools for further training and research in genetics and debated the basis of addiction with experts in this field. Robert's "Biochemistry" qualifications and training was ideal for this role.

To compliment further his psychological qualifications, Robert undertook postgraduate studies in Counselling and Meditation-Based Stress Management (a clinical program, Community Medicine, Monash University).

Robert has been very active in Alcohol and Drug Awareness and rehabilitation since 1990. His career continued to progress naturally with the design and development of educational tools, including: ABOUT A DRUG CALLED ALCOHOL (Video and Booklet), ARE YOU OVER .05? (Pamphlet and Poster), GENETIC PREDISPOSITION AND ALCOHOLISM (Booklet), MEDITATION-BASED STRESS MANAGEMENT PROGRAM (Booklet), KNOW YOUR LIMIT (DVD) and KNOW YOUR LIMIT APP launched on both android and apple stores.

A milestone in Robert's career was the the launch of a legendary and historical campaign in July 2011 aiming at changing the way Australians perceive the drug alcohol. Synergistically, Robert also launched the slogans:

.05 WHETHER OR NOT YOU DRIVE.**

In 2011, as a result of his professional and community efforts, Robert was nominated for Australian of the Year by Professor Jon Currie, Head of Addiction Medicine at St Vincent's Hospital.

Governments play an important role in educating the community on various aspects of health and lifestyle, however, Robert prefers not to remain idle whilst waiting for such projects to be implemented. Thus, Robert became highly active in public education and health awareness such as personally funding a Radio campaign (3 AW) on alcohol awareness which was instrumental in information provision across the community. Such efforts include Robert's features in both electronic and printed media. He has been interviewed on numerous occasions by various broadcasters such as Derryn Hinch, Nick McCallum and others.

Robert's research on alcohol and message of awareness was often featured in newspapers such as the Herald Sun and TV Programs such as "a current affair" and Today Tonight".

In so doing, Robert began an irreversible and steady momentum for behavioural change across future Australian generations.

EXPERIENCE

2015: LAUNCH OF KNOW YOUR LIMIT APP ON IPHONE AND ANDROID (BLO-LO).

This Mobile App, a part of the knowyourlimit.com.au range of educational tools, is designed to prevent drink / drug driving and increase awareness in the community. Blo-Lo (www.blo-lo.com.au) is the first of its kind worldwide. Available freely on both [android](#) and [iPhone](#), this app provides a screening assessment of a person's influence under alcohol, drugs or other factors including fatigue. Individual Motor skills are assessed digitally bypassing limitations of biochemical marker technologies. As modern synthetic designer drugs are becoming much harder to detect in the laboratory despite their extremely potent biochemical effect at minute doses, drug impairment must now rely on skills testing methods that include "walk and turn" test, etc. This app is designed to enable an individual make an informed decision regarding personal the extent of impairment. The person's parameters, when unaffected by triggers, are tested and stored as control. These are then paired against results from tests undertaken whilst the same individual is in an "affected state". The results are extremely significant as they use as control / margin the SAME individual bench control results. Know Your Limit is the first app worldwide capable of providing such specific analysis of a person's reflexes regardless of health, age, body size, shape, gender, or tolerance considerations. Blo-lo includes a Blood Alcohol Concentration Guide, health warnings and facts about alcohol, drugs and fatigue. Significantly, a validated drug-dependence assessment quiz is also available to be undertaken by those contemplating change and wanting a confidential assessment in the privacy of their own personal space. This serves as a synergistic and valuable insight for those contemplating a change in lifestyle.

2011: AUSTRALIAN OF THE YEAR AWARD

Prof. Jon Currie, Addiction Medicine at St. Vincent's Hospital in Melbourne, nominated Robert Kaldawi for the Australian of the Year Award.

2011: RADIO ALCOHOL AWARENESS CAMPAIGN

An alcohol awareness campaign, second to none was launched on Melbourne Radio, created and funded by Robert Kaldawi. This campaign included the slogans: "IF YOU BINGE DRINK YOUR BRAIN WILL SHRINK and .05 WHETHER OR NOT YOU DRIVE". Other points of awareness included the effect of alcohol mediated brain damage which is manifested through "blackout" and the increased sensitivity of women to alcohol.

2011: Certification of Smart Breathalysers under Australian Standards AS 3547

Dr. Kaldawi successfully launched Mark 1, Mark 2, Mark 3 Smart Breathalyser Range. In order to ensure scientific validity and reliability, Robert commissioned a New Zealand Laboratory to test and certify these breathalysers. In March 2011, Robert finally received the certification results thereby showing scientific certification under Australian Standards AS 3547.

2010: Launch of Know Your Limit Educational Kit

Dr. Kaldawi launched the Educational Kits "Know Your Limit" which he designed to educate Australians about the "drug" alcohol. The kits contain an educational DVD, a Blood Alcohol Estimation Scientific Guide, A Standard Drink Measure and a Smart Breathalyser. Soon afterwards, the kit became part of the National Catalogue of Resources and Educational Tools for the Australian Drug Foundation.

Robert researched, designed and developed the KNOW YOUR LIMIT EDUCATIONAL KIT.

IDT acquired NKCL in November, 1987. As a Scientist, Dr Kaldawi's responsibilities consisted of formulation, manufacture, drug testing and stability of a variety of pharmaceutical and veterinary products; these include effervescent tablets, liquid pharmaceutical preparations and sustained release medication. Moreover, Dr. Kaldawi designed and conducted clinical / taste trial protocols and manufacture / packaging of pharmaceuticals under Good Manufacturing Practice. Significantly, work carried out at NKCL led to a patent being successfully launched for an Ibuprofen Liquid Formulation. Dr. Kaldawi carried out this work and was the primary author of the said application.

Ayerst Laboratories are manufacturers of a range of pharmaceutical and OTC products. These include ethical products such as Premarin (Hormone Replacement Therapy), Isordil (Angina / Heart Medication), Murelax (Benzodiazepines) and others. Dr Kaldawi's position entailed conducting educational seminars for GPs on the indications, contraindications, side effects and latest research regarding such medication.
